Mandatory Reporting of Child Sexual Abuse Crimes to Police

NC Law requires immediate reporting to police of a sexual offense against a juvenile under the age of 18. This includes solicitation, conspiracy to commit or aiding and abetting any of these crimes.

The following CSA crimes must be reported to local law enforcement:

- Rape/Attempted rape/Statutory rape
- Sexual offense/Attempted sexual offense/Statutory sexual offense
- Incest or the commission/allowing of a sexual act by a parent or guardian
- Sexual activity by a substitute parent or custodian
- Sexual activity with a student
- Sexual battery
- Employing/permitting a minor to assist in offenses against public morality/decency
- Felonious indecent exposure
- Indecent liberties (immoral, improper, indecent, lewd or lascivious sexual behavior)
- Indecent liberties with a student
- Sexual exploitation
- Solicitation of child by electronic device to commit an unlawful sex act
- Human trafficking
- Patronizing a prostitute who is a minor or has a mental disability
- Promoting prostitution of a minor or a person who has a mental disability
- Parent or caretaker commits/permits an act of prostitution with or by a juvenile
